What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	100%	We have prioritized school swimming to provide top up swimming to ensure the whole school is competent and confident in the water.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke, and breaststroke]?	100%	All children take part in school swimming from Reception year to year 6. By the time they leave in Year 6 they are competent and confident swimmers who are able to use a range of strokes.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort are able to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	0%	Children in Year 5 and 6 take part in Self Rescue and water Safety sessions. They are not assessed on this aspect until the summer term in Year 6.
